INTRODUCTION

Canada is a large, diverse, and multicultural country that counts people from all over the world as Canadian citizens. Canada is the second largest country in the world, geographically!

The Global Choice Canada program offers placements ranging from metropolitan locations near major Canadian cities to smaller and more rural settings with tight-knit communities. Our schools provide many opportunities for students to develop their skills and leadership abilities through sports teams and after-school clubs.





WHY IS IT CALLED GLOBAL CHOICE?

The Global Choice program provides students with the opportunity to choose which part of Canada they're placed in. The 'choice' in Global Choice is that you're able to choose your school district.



Once you choose your program, you then get to pick your top 3 choices from the list of schools available. School choices are not always guaranteed and your ability to attend specific schools depends on factors such as your English level, dietary restrictions, or allergies that require specific homestay placements. If you submit your application late, this can also impact your school choices as some of your top choices might fill up. The only exception to the 'choice' is the program in Kingston, ON where students are unable to choose their school, they can only choose between an urban or rural placement.

- ★ Our partners provide dedicated Local Homestay Coordinators and emergency support that is available 24/7.

A NOTE ON MULTICULTURALISM

Canadians come in all shapes and sizes. Canada is known as a multicultural country that promotes cultural and religious diversity. In the 2021 census, more than 450 ethnic or cultural origins were reported by Canadians. In practice, what this means is that individuals and families may strongly identify with their cultural origins even long after they immigrated to Canada. For example, an individual with Indian heritage may describe themselves as "Indo-Canadian", even if they were born in Canada. Conversely, someone with the same background may simply think of themselves as "Canadian". There is no correct way to define cultural heritage in Canada, as this is considered personal to the individual and family.

What is most important for students to understand is that Canadians are Canadian regardless of cultural origin. A family who immigrated to Canada and/or whose first language is not English or French is no less Canadian than anyone else. For Canadians, this is one of our most cherished cultural values.

IMPORTANT THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND

- There are additional monthly fees for students with dietary
 restrictions. This can include (but is not limited to) celiac disease, vegan,
 vegetarian, halal, lactose intolerance, and more. Your contact at AFS will
 let you know if this applies to you.
- For grade 12 students, we can not guarantee a high school diploma.

 This depends on your English level and ability to take higher level courses to earn credits towards graduation. In the provinces of Newfoundland and British Columbia, it is currently impossible to earn a high school diploma in 1 year as a foreign student due to provincial legislation.
- Not all programs can accommodate students with certain allergies,
 dietary restrictions, or medical restrictions due to limitations in the host
 family network. If you have any limiting factors please let the AFS
 representative in your country know so that they can provide you with a list
 of programs suitable for you.
- Host families are compensated on a monthly basis to help with the cost of hosting students.



They provide multiple opportunities for students to develop their skills and leadership through sports teams and after school clubs.



HIGHLIGHTS:

- 1 hour from Ottawa. 1-2 hours from Montreal.
- Mostly rural placements with some placements in small cities like Brockville, Cornwall, and Rockland.
- Public transportation is only available in the city, there is little to no public transportation in rural areas.
- Some activities are available at an extra cost such as trips to Quebec City, Niagara Falls, Toronto, and more.

Upper Canada was the original name of what is now known as the province of Ontario. 'Upper' refers to its geographic location along the Great Lakes as opposed to Lower Canada, modern day Quebec.

LAMBTON KENT DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD (LKDSB)

The LKDSB is located in Southwestern Ontario. The district serves the two small cities of Chatham and Sarnia, as well as several other smaller communities. They are located near many historic sites, such as the underground railroad, the Great Lakes and two provincial parks! The schools focus on personal relationships, priding themselves on the extensive support and communication they give to their students. The School District employs an Academic Coordinator, as well as two International Education Coordinators, who work solely with International students to ensure that they have the necessary resources to succeed in their program.

- Public transportation is somewhat available in the larger towns of Chatham and Sarnia. But please note that most placements will be in rural locations where public transportation is not available.

The host family that I have lived with here in Canada is made up by the two hosts, Michele and Jim, and by another girl from Thailand that is doing my same exchange, called Best. We were lucky to have found

host parents that wanted us to love Canada as much as they do, and so they brought us sightseeing in many places in our areas, such as Niagara Falls and Toronto. My favourite memory with them is when we visited Bayfied for a weekend, and we got to experience the Canadian Christmas and also have a lot of fun!

After spending 10 months in Canada, I have learned to love this country so much! - This program is not currently able to offer placements to students with Celiac Disease due to homestay availability.
- Students with an English level below B1 will only be able to attend one of the 5 schools that offers ESL courses. Those schools are marked in the table below with an *.

HIGHLIGHTS:

- Capital city of Canada, located 2 hours from Montreal and 4 hours from Toronto.
- Most placements are located in the suburbs of the city with easy access to downtown via public transportation.

FROM **GERMANY** Exchange in **Newfoundland**

"Starting in September 2021, I had the amazing experience of doing an exchange in beautiful Newfoundland. Until my host family picked me up at the airport, I couldn't realize that the time had come for me to start my stay abroad.

The familiar and very friendly manner that my host parents showed me made me feel at home straight away. I lived in a small community called Bauline.

This is in the eastern part of the island of Newfoundland, which is often called The Rock because it is made almost entirely of stone. There are only about 500 people living in my community and it is right on the North Atlantic Ocean.

The school system is a little different to what we are used to in Germany. School starts at 8:05 in the morning and I took a yellow school bus to school, which stopped right outside my front door. You also only have 7 subjects in total but only 5 of your subjects every day and are therefore free at 2:05 pm. My first experiences at the school were all very positive. All the teachers are very friendly and understanding. At the beginning, I found it a little difficult to follow the teachers in class because they like to talk a lot and sometimes very quickly. But you get used to it over time and I could always count on the help of my classmates.

Outside of school, I played soccer once a week and we went to a fitness class together as a team every Tuesday. I also often went shopping with my best friends at a nearby mall. I visited the sights in my area with my host family.



I recently read this quote: "The best things in life are the people we love, the places we've been and all the memories we've made along the way" And during my time abroad, I was able to experience so many wonderful things and meet so many wonderful people. To sum up, I can only say that these five months were a complete success and I enjoyed every day I was there. I can only recommend it to everyone as it was a great experience."

The LRSD is located in Winnipeg, the capital city of the province of Manitoba. Manitoba is a prairie province that is known for its expansive blue skies and 100,000+ lakes. Along with the English program, the LRSD also has 2 French Immersion schools that students can attend. As a French Immersion student, you would go to school in French but live with an English-speaking family, giving you the opportunity to improve you skills in both languages! Students who wish to attend one of these schools will need at least a B1 French level.
